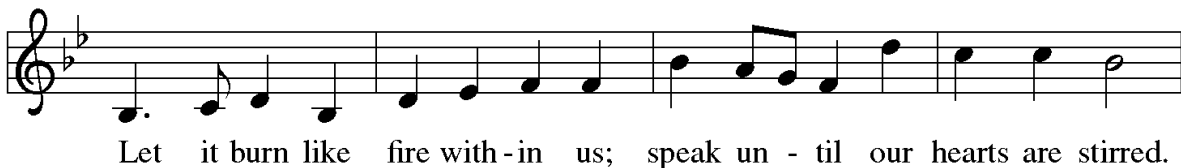

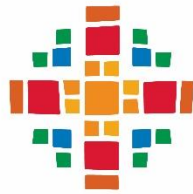


ZACH MCKINZIE
