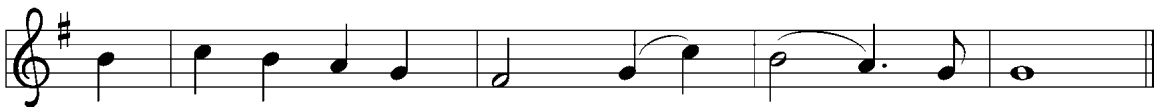

Next we light the Christ candle which shines the light of God's love on all people.

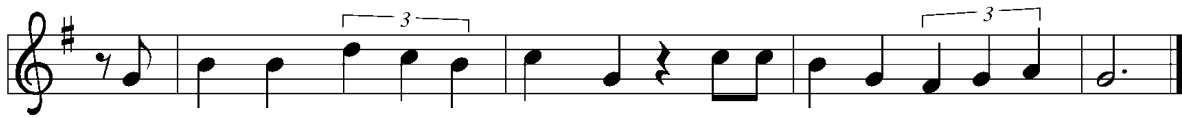

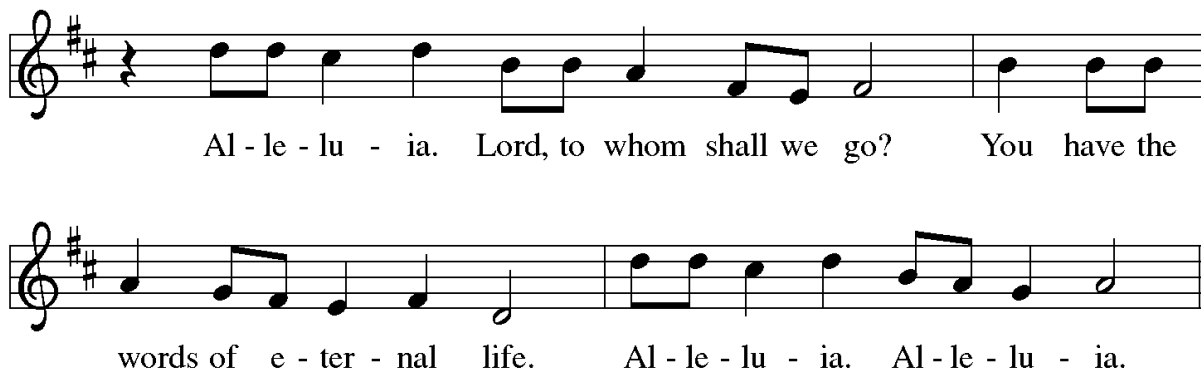

and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

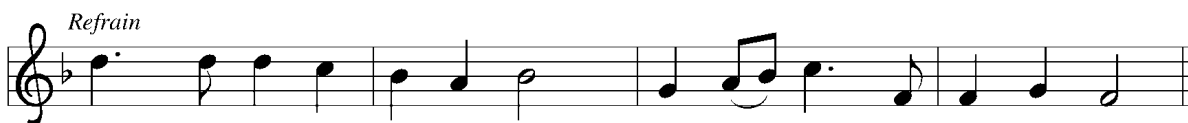


